
February 13.

Actor Macdonald Carey will make a guest appearance at the event and receive a special tribute. The screen and television performer will receive a special award for his humanitarian efforts in the fields of mental health and aging.



Myra Harrison, president of Harrison Industries, is being honored for her long-time service to Ventura County as a businesswoman and also for her exceptional philanthropy. In 1932 she and her husband, the late E.J. Harrison, founded what is now E.J. Harrison and Sons, the oldest privately-held trash collection firm in the United States. Many Ventura County organizations have been the beneficiaries of Myra Harrison's generosity over the years. Among them are the Ventura Boys and Girls Club, the Ventura Board of Realtors Adopta-School Project, the Ventura County Medical Research Foundation, the Ventura County Council of the Boy Scouts, the Saticoy Little League, the Dudley House Restoration, and Ventura County Special Olympics.



Dr. Lloyd Fellows, a clinical psychologist and ordained minister, is presently serving as foreman of the Ventura County Grand Jury. A former staff member at Camarillo State Hospital, and instructor at California State University Northridge and California Lutheran University, he founded the Family Counseling Center in Oxnard in 1972. Volunteer service has always been

a high priority for Dr. Fellows. He has served on the CAREGIVERS Advisory Board, and is currently a member of the Board of Directors of both the Ojai Chapter and the Ventura County Chapter of the American Red Cross. A qualified mental health worker for the Red Cross National Disaster Team, he may be sent anywhere in the United States to help provide mental health services in times of disaster.



Macdonald Carey, 80, holds the record for being the longest-working actor under contract to NBC. He acted in 40 major motion pictures from 1942–1980. He is perhaps even more famous for his 25-year career playing the character Dr. Tom Horton on "Days of Our Lives." One of Hollywood's most prolific and versatile stars, he has appeared on stage, radio, television, and film.

In private life, Carey volunteers his time for various charitable committees of the Catholic Church and makes personal and media appearances on behalf of the mental health movement. In

Norma, 80, was suddenly widowed one month before her call to CAREGIVERS in 1990. Since she did not drive, she needed transportation to medical appointments and for shopping, as well as someone to talk to as she worked through her grief. Norma's own health was not the best, so when we were able to match her with Joan and Paul, a husband and wife team, Norma was able to get most of her needs met. As time went by, her needs increased so that during her last year of independent living, Joan and Paul were providing an average of 25 hours of time and 50 miles of transportation per month.

After Norma's surgery and hospitalization she became increasingly frail, and would not be able to live alone any longer. With the support of Joan and Paul and with counseling by the CAREGIVERS professional staff, Norma made a smooth and happy transition to a residential care facility in Orange County near her only relatives.

Reverse Mortgage

New Reverse Mortgage Can Increase Income for Seniors

Now available to seniors seeking loans on their homes is a reverse mortgage plan offered for the first time by a major insurance carrier, Transamerica HomeFirst. This development provides the consumer with more security, explained Linda Hubbard, vice president of Transamerica HomeFirst, in a recent phone interview.

A standard reverse mortgage is a special type of loan available to senior homeowners over the age of 62. It allows seniors to tap the equity acquired in their homes to generate a monthly income, according to Jim Woodard, writing in the November 7 edition of the Ventura Star-Free Press.

The senior homeowner receives a monthly check from the mortgage company, reversing the direction of conventional mortgage payments.

The recent significant development is that the new Transamerica reverse mortgage plan allows seniors over 65 who own a home valued at \$100,000

or more to continue receiving payments for the rest of their lives, whether they live in their home or not.

Previously, reverse mortgages limited payments to the period of time in which the senior owned and resided in the home.

Woodard said that there has been a lot of interest in reverse mortgages among seniors over the years, particularly in Ventura County, where 78 percent of seniors own their own homes. And a third of those seniors are over age 75.

How a reverse mortgage plan works

For a fixed number of years, the senior (borrower) receives monthly loan advances from a reverse mortgage on his or her home. The time covered by these payments is determined by the borrower's age and life expectancy.

When those payments stop on a pre-determined date, the borrower's monthly income continues, paid from the annuity

Focusing originally on church congregations as the source of volunteers who would be recruited, trained and matched in a one-on-one relationship with an elder requesting aid, Buenaventura Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers was developed as a non-profit corporation. The Director and Assistant Director were, respectively, Sister Patricia Callahan, CSJ and Sister Veronica Maloney, CSJ.

In its first year of operation, the organization served 72 people. Since then over 1,250 Ventura County residents have benefited from the long-term help of our dedicated and caring volunteers. Several thousands more have been aided through counseling, referrals to other services, and one- or

two-time emergency service. In addition, we have provided assistance to many, many family members and friends who have called us seeking help for an elderly person.

We began our program in Santa Paula in 1989, with funding through the Area Agency on Aging, United Way, the Swift Memorial Health Care Foundation, and with the support we needed from the community. In September 1992, we also opened an office in Fillmore.

We at CAREGIVERS are very proud of our growth and our service to the community. We thank all of you who have contributed your time and financial support, for without that none of it would have been possible.

purchased in the borrower's name at the time the reverse mortgage is closed.

All borrowers must accept monthly payments of at least \$150. But, they may choose to take some of their equity in either a line of credit reserve account or in a lump sum. Woodard said it's a very flexible plan with many options.

The borrower is charged interest on all loan advances and will owe the lending company at least 50 percent of the home's future appreciation (increased value). However, the total amount

owed can never exceed the future value of the home.

Transamerica's plan includes an annuity provided by Metropolitan Life Insurance Co. or Transamerica Occidental Life Insurance Co., another subsidiary of Transamerica.

Hubbard at Transamerica HomeFirst, which is a subsidiary of the major national Transamerica Corp., says senior homeowners need to study all aspects of currently-available loan plans and to investigate the financial strength of the insurance companies offering the annuities.

One element to note is that annuity payments that are part of the newly-offered plan are viewed as income by both the IRS and public benefit programs like Supplemental Security Income and Medicaid.

Not only will borrowers pay taxes on their annuity income, it could also reduce any benefits they receive from SSI or Medicaid. According to some experts, in some instances the annuity income could make a homeowner ineligible to receive any public benefits.
